Electrtonic pianos in the music room will broaden the musical interest in students and help students learn how to play the piano. Two outdoor tables will be used for students at lunch as well as for an outdoor classroom. Hand-held radios were purchased to be used by the teachers for communicating with the offices when taking students outdoors. The kindergarten classroom will be getting a white board. A large fan for the gym has been ordered as well.




