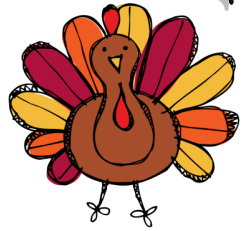
Krazy Kindergarten

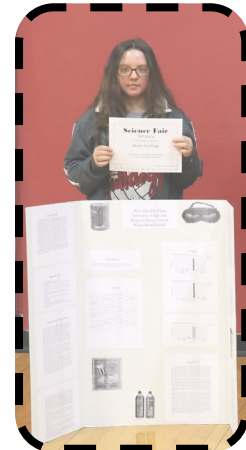

Mr. Bergen's Math Corner

Hello fellow mathematicians,

The answers to the last edition of Math Corner are at the end of this edition.

Elementary Riddle (K-4):

Q. Imagine you are at Thanksgiving dinner with two other people. A fresh pie just came out of the oven, and you want to share it equally between the three of you. How can you cut it using straight across lines so that you all get equal amounts of pie?

Middle School Riddle (5-8):

Q. You are traveling for Thanksgiving to visit your Gran Gran in Texas. On a map from your house to hers is 5cm. The map has a scale of 1cm = 135mi.

Part 1: How far is it to Gran Gran's house from your house?

Part 2: If you drive an average speed of 75mi/hr, and leave at 6:00AM, when will you arrive at her house?

High School Riddle (9-12):

Q. Same question as Middle School, but I want to add: your car gets 20mpg and has an 18 gallon gas tank. If gasoline is \$1.72/gal and you are on empty, how much will it cost in gas to drive to Gran Gran's house and back?

Elementary Riddle (K-4):

Q. When Billy Bob was 14 years old, his brother was half his age. Now that Billy Bob is 40, how old is his brother?

A. If his little brother is half his age when Billy Bob is 14, then his brother is 7 years old. Although his brother will not always be half his age, he will always be 7 years younger, so when Billy Bob is 40, his little brother will be 33.

Middle School Riddle (5-8):

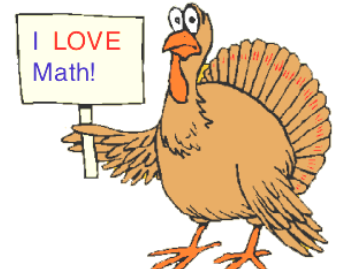
Q. We are two real numbers whose sum is greater than 10, but whose product is less than 10. What are we?

A. You can solve this problem using guess and check or by a system of inequalities. The explanation for systems of inequalities is too long for here, so I will say the key to this problem is that it has multiple correct answers and the numbers allowed are "Real" which is a set of numbers that includes rational numbers (fractions, decimals, etc...) So... $12+0.5 = 12.5$ which is greater than 10 and $12(0.5) = 6$ which is less than 10 would be one answer to this problem. What are the others?

Q. Bring me your example, and I will share some of my favorites in the next edition of Math Corner.

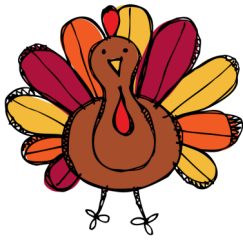
