Each month, a color version of the school newspaper "Barks 'n' Growls" is posted. Be sure to visit the district website for all this and much more!

Also, on the website is a link to PowerSchool, our student information system. By utilizing this link, parents can access individual student information. A parent can check student attendance, current grades and lunch balances. If you have already been using this feature, your log-in information has not changed. If you need log-in information, just call the school and we'll give it to you.





our next game!"








