We have hit the beginning of the year with a positive note and are so excited to see what the year brings us!



Hello, my name is Ms. Tiffany Erickson. I am the Ballard Art/FACS teacher and sponsor of the 7th Grade Bulldogs!

The 7th Grade Bulldogs are the "Magnificent Seven!" There are seven 7th graders who truly are magnificent to work with! We have been working hard as Community Leaders. We work hard to get assignments done! We work hard to keep Ms. E's room neat! There is a pumpkin decorating contest! We have the best spirit! We will win for sure!

What else is going on in Ms. E's Room? Well, let me tell you!

Art 1: Students have finished projects using the "stippling" technique (use of dots) with mix medium to create images of flowers on drawing paper. The next project, students will practice and create landscapes with the scumbling technique.

8th Grade Art: Students have finished the "Picasso Fish" that display student's use of line and color inspired by the well-known artist, Pablo Picasso. Students have such vibrant colors and use of lines! During the making of the project, students researched the life of Pablo Picasso and wrote reflections. We must connect with art!

3D Art: Student were working toward the creation of a self-portrait face mask and arm with cast wraps. Students will use plaster of Paris to make molds of self-images. This cast project will include cultural aesthetic designs of students' choice. Students were to research the culture of choice for ideas to design the mask and arm. So far, the faces have been made into molds. The next steps will be to make the arm cast and decorate!

Early Elementary:

**Kindergarten:** Students have made collage self-portraits to show that they can be safe with art supplies and materials to make art. Students practiced using paper, scissors, glue, crayons, and markers. Students also learned how to make paper look like heads, eyes, nose, ears, mouths, and hair.

**1st-2nd Grade:** Students have made Kandinsky Squares/Circles. This was a fun project that introduced students to the vocabulary terms "concentric" and "abstract." Students explored shapes, color, crayons, and watercolor.

**3rd-4th Grade** Students have been working on Symmetrical Designs inspired by the artist Natalia Ostapenko. The project demonstrates students understanding of symmetrical design, contrast, warm, and cool colors.

**5th-6th Grade** Students have been developing Narrative Landscapes with watercolor. The artwork was inspired by the artist David Fredrich. Students demonstrate their understanding of the different parts of a landscape scene, for example, background, mid-ground, and foreground in the creation of their watercolor scenes. In addition to creating a landscape, students will write a short narrative with a beginning, middle, and end to complement their illustrations.

All Grades Project: Now it is Fall, let's celebrate with a Fall theme mosaic! All grades are making leaves out of clay for a mosaic. Students gain experience working with different materials of clay, color, wedging, rolling, slab, printmaking, etching, paint, and glaze. All members of the Ballard Family are welcome to join us by making a ceramic leaf to add to the Fall Mosaic. This project is hopeful that it will demonstrate how Ballard is a place of unity!
